SPELLACY'S SPOTLIGHT

This month's "Spotlight" falls on "Red Sox Rich" Biela. I met with Rich and his wife Joan at Denny's for coffee and conversation on Wednesday, June 14.

Ed: Where do you hail from, Rich?

Rich: I was born in Steubenville, Ohio and grew up in the nearby town of Weirton, West Virginia, 39 miles from Pittsburg and 79 miles from Cleveland. In 1954, we moved to the Oakland CA area, and I graduated from Hayward High in 1957.

Ed: There's got to be a story about how you became "Red Sox Rich", since you grew up in "Pirates" and "Indians" territory.

Rich: Here's the true story. When I was around 9 years old, my Dad took me to an Indians ball game in Cleveland to watch them play the Red Sox. The Boston right fielder was the "Splendid Splinter", Ted Williams, the last man in the Major Leagues to hit over .400 for a season. From that day on, Ted was my favorite player and the Red Sox my favorite team, and 68 years later, they still are. I even listen to radio broadcasts of their games on my tablet, and we go to see the "Sox" when they play the Giants at AT@T Park. Yes, I am "Red Sox Rich"!

Ed: Tell us a little about your career, Rich.

Rich: I went through US Army training at Fort Bliss in El Paso, Texas in 1960, and later went through missile systems training at Fort Ord, which led to my service in the NIKE Ajax and NIKE Hercules programs. I served also at Mather Field in the National Guard counter-drug program and went on to have a full time career with the California National Guard for 39 years, retiring in 1999 as a Chief Master Sergeant (E-8).

Ed: Please share some thoughts on your "Sirs" experiences.

Rich: I joined our "Sirs" branch in 2000, during the time when they had their meetings at the "Sheepherders Inn " in Rancho. I had to be on a waiting list for a while, since they could have a maximum of only 150 members due to the size constraints of "Sheepherders". During my early years in the Branch, there were many activities for both the guys and their wives. I and my wife Joan, with whom I recently celebrated our 25th anniversary, were active in the Branch travel club chaired by John Valiska, and we enjoyed many fun day trips and even a 5 day stay in Laughlin, NV with about 30 other folks. Since the move to the Elks Club, our membership has gradually gone down, but it is coming back up, and we would like to see more events for couples to enjoy.

Ed: You are a vital part of our Branch, Rich. What does the future hold in store?

Rich: Joan and I love to travel. We've done 11 cruises, visited countries around the world, and enjoy "Mystery Trips" with Sports Leisure Travel. Joan and I are also involved with a group called "Relay for Life" that works with cancer patients. We had a nice time at the recent Branch trip to Raley Field to watch our "River Cats" play the Fresno "Grizzlies". The local guys lost, but we enjoyed the camaraderie. As you know, I handle Absentee Call Ins for the Branch. I really like all you guys, but would you please be more diligent about calling me when you will not be having lunch? It's really important, just as it's important to call in your lunch order if you will be partaking of the meal. I hope to be around for many more good years with Branch 112.
